#### LOCAL BOY SCOUT PACKS AND TROOPS TO COLLECT SHOES FOR SOLES4SOULS

Used shoe collection drive in Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky communities helps fight poverty, create a cleaner environment, and provide hope to thousands in need

**CINCINNATI** (Jan. 22, 2019) – 1.2 billion people live on less than \$1.90 per day – and many don't have access to one of life's most basic necessities: a good pair of shoes. Cub Scout Packs and Boy Scout Troops in Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky are working to change that, with a goal of collecting 25,000 pairs of shoes from community members on **Scout Sunday, February 3, 2019**. The shoes will be donated to Soles4Souls, a non-profit organization that distributes shoes to those in need. This year, Dan Beard Council is happy to partner with Walmart as store locations will serve as the main collection points throughout the tri-state area.

Local Scouts and Walmart employees will be volunteering at each of the drop-off sites to help collect the shoes. Over the next few weeks, customers at the drop-off locations will see event flyers in their bags as well as on social media. Shoes can be dropped off at Walmart locations from 11am until 2pm, and the Scout Achievement Center, the Scout Headquarters in Evandale, from 11am until 3pm on Sunday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Soles4Souls collection drive organized by the Dan Beard Council is a council-wide community service project for local scouts who are looking to help make an impact for our community. Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts will collect used shoes at organizations throughout Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky, including local Walmart locations, schools, churches, and the Dan Beard Council office in Evendale. The collected shoes will be distributed by Soles4Souls in regions where they are needed most, from third-world nations to communities within the United States.

The Dan Beard Council's units (packs, troops, and crews) have been dedicated to helping Souls4Soles over the past three years. Over 33,000 pairs of shoes have been collected by the Dan Beard Council's local Boy Scout packs in the 2017 and 2018 Shoe Drives. From 2017 to the present, nearly 500 Scout units all over the tri-state area have participated in the drive. Also, Scouts, leaders, and volunteers accounted for nearly 3,200 service hours during the 2017 & 2018 collection.

"An important aspect of the Scout Oath is that members will do their best to help other people at all times," said Jeff Taylor at the Dan Beard Council. "The council-wide Soles4Souls project is a great way for our Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts to involve the community and make a meaningful impact by helping people in need around the world."
